SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 CREW AND EQUIPMENT

- 2.1 Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the Race Committee.

- 2.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless approved by the Race Committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

2.3 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located near the race office in Sandhamn.

4 CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted by 08.00 on the day they will take effect.
- 4.2 Changes in the time schedule will be posted by 18.00 on the day before they take effect.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagpole outside the race office in Sandhamn.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in race signal AP.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 Registrations and tune up

- 6.2 Dates of racing
- Thursday July 21 - Saturday July 23 Racing all classes
- The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 11.00

- 6.3 Eight (8) races are planned.
- 6.4 When there has been a long postponement and when more than one race (or sequence of races, for two or more classes) will be held on the same day, the warning signal for the first race and each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable. To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, an orange flag will be displayed with one long sound for at least four minutes before a warning signal is displayed.
- 6.5 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 15.00.

9 THE COURSES

- 9.1 The diagram on page 5 shows the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

Outer course

- 9.2 At the gates 2A/2B and 5A/5B boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark.
- 9.3 The approximate course length will be 60 minutes.

10 MARKS

- 10.1 The marks are orange or yellow marks.

11 THE START

- 11.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee vessel and a spar buoy with a flag.
- 11.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.
- 11.3 A boat starting later than 15 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes rule A4.

12 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff on the Race Committee vessel displaying a blue flag and a spar buoy with a flag.

13 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 13.1 The penalty rule 44.3 will apply
- 13.2 For the Dragon class rule 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is requested.

14 TIME LIMITS

- 14.1 Time limits are 180 minutes.
- 14.2 Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat in the class sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4.

15 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1 Protest forms are available at the race office. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.
- 15.2 For each class, the protest time is 60 minutes and begins when the boats have had reasonable time to return to the harbour from the course.
- 15.3 Notice will be posted within 10 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witness. Hearings will be held in the jury room.
- 15.4 Notices of protests by the Race Committee or Protest Committee will be posted on the official notice board to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 15.5 A mediation/arbitration system will be in operation for protests of rules in Part 2. The details of the system are to be found in page 6.

16 SCORING

- 16.1 The low point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply, so that when three or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of here races scores.
- 16.2 Three races are required to be completed to a championship.

17 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 18.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.

18 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

Championship prizes according to the Swedish Racing-regulations.

KSSS prizes according to the number of boats entered: one prize for every five boats or part of five.

19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

20 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
